Episode Structure

Each episode begins with a series of breath-taking establishing shots focussing on the star of each episode: the plane, the ship, the train, the submarine - arriving at their respective pit stops. The viewer will get an idea of the logistical effort it takes to “park” these monsters. We're talking centimetre precision manoeuvres of vehicles the size of several football fields. And once the plane, train or ship is parked, an army of experts - each in their own right - descend upon the work station and get to work immediately. For once it's in the hangar/dry dock or railway yard, the countdown begins.

Hundreds of experts descent on the plane, train or ship and try to check each single part inside out. In case any part is defective, it needs to be replaced with record speed. For every additional hour the vehicle is out of service, potential profits are at risk.
